This covered all aspects of football, such as shooting, passing, futsal, and goalkeeping. We also met a local celebrity and female ambassador for Liverpool football club, Natasha Dowie, who was on hand to answer questions about her career and meet our students. We were lucky enough to have a chat and get a photograph. After lunch, they had the opportunity to visit a range of interactive stations and stalls hosted by Merseyside Police and a wide range of partners, including Merseyside Fire Service, the North West Ambulance Service, and the Merseyside Violence Reduction Partnership. The event was so inspiring and filled with insight into the opportunities that girls have now, especially in football.

What we have been learning this term

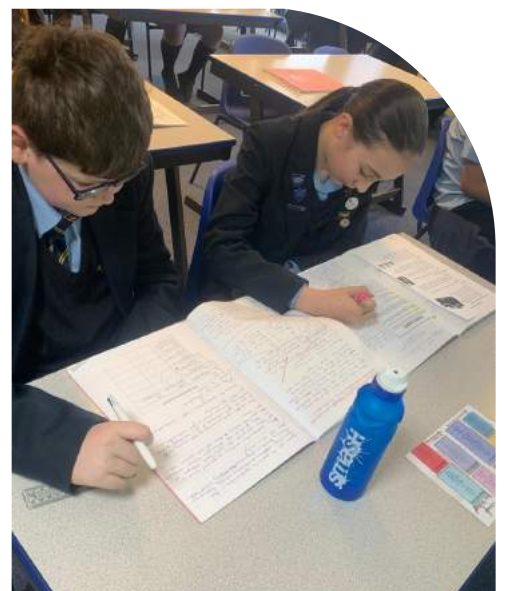
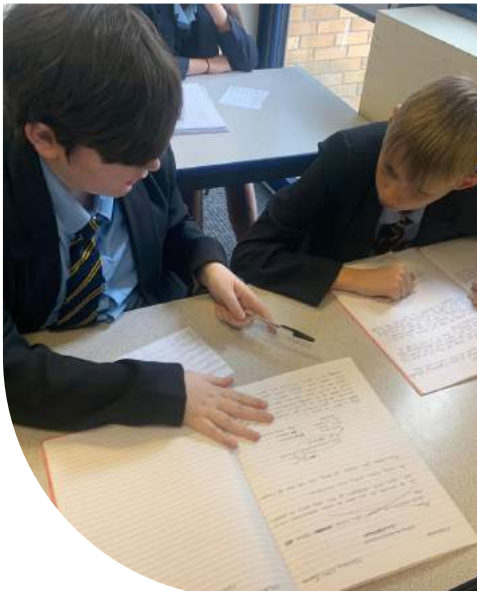

Our schemes of work are designed to be an engaging, well sequenced, meaningful and effective way of exploring personal belief in order to help evolve, challenge and support the Christian development of every young person.

Year 7 *Exploring the gifts of the power of the Holy Spirit*

Exploring the gifts of the Holy Spirit, Year 7 demonstrated their knowledge of Pentecost and the sacrament of confirmation by creating flames and leaflets that connected these gifts with their importance and future actions in the community. Mrs. Snelson was thrilled with the focus and determination the students showed. The students enjoyed using the new Bibles donated by the Jerusalem Trust. Lessons from the new RE directory have been both enjoyable and challenging, enabling students to work together while deepening their faith and understanding of how to read the Bible.

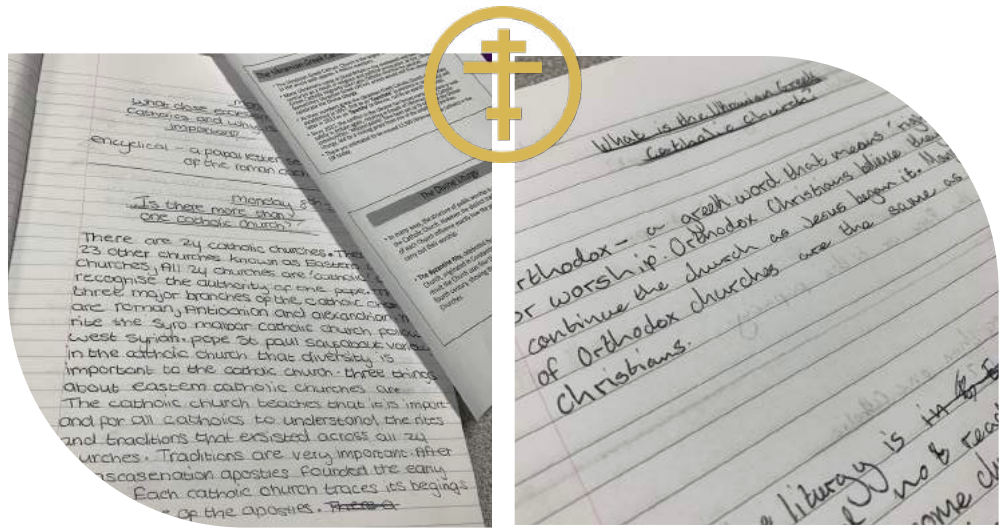


Mrs Meritt's Year 7 class have been learning about the Holy Spirit and Pentecost, and have been developing their collaboration skills by peer-assessing each other's written work. Mr Monaghan also joined us during this session for a peer observation to support our formative assessment work. Year 8 *Exploring different types of Catholic Church*

Year 8 students have been exploring the diversity of the Catholic Church, gaining insight into the unique traditions and practices that distinguish them. They focused on the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church and its rich liturgical heritage. Mrs Snelson was very impressed by the students understanding of the many different faith traditions within the Catholic community.



Year 9 *Interfaith dialogue and Hinduism*

Year 9 have begun a unit on interfaith dialogue and Hinduism in RE, examining a major world religion in detail. Year 9 showed their creative skills in designing their own Hindu gods, representing the characteristics of Brahman. They then explained these, showing their knowledge of Hindu belief in monotheism. Mrs Meritt was delighted with their hard work and engagement.



Year 10 *Exam preparation and revision*

Year 10 students have been working so hard preparing for the examinations this term. They have been completing past paper questions to improve their extended writing exam skills; they have created detailed revision cue cards and many have attended after-school intervention sessions giving targeted knowledge to close gaps in knowledge and address misconceptions. The St Mary's RE department is delighted with the commitment Year 10 have shown throughout the whole of this exam period, and we are very excited to see them reap the rewards of their hard work.

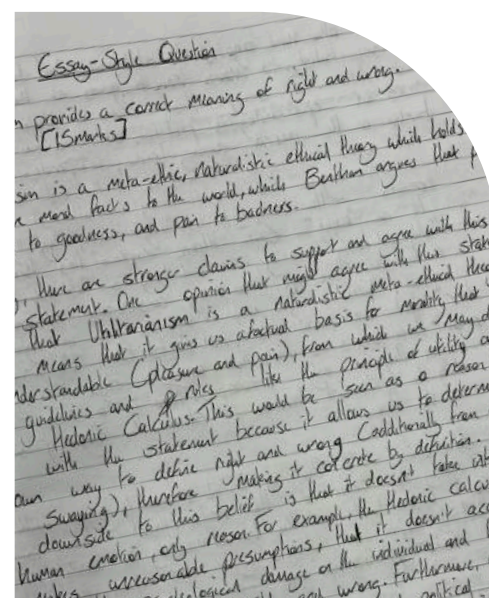
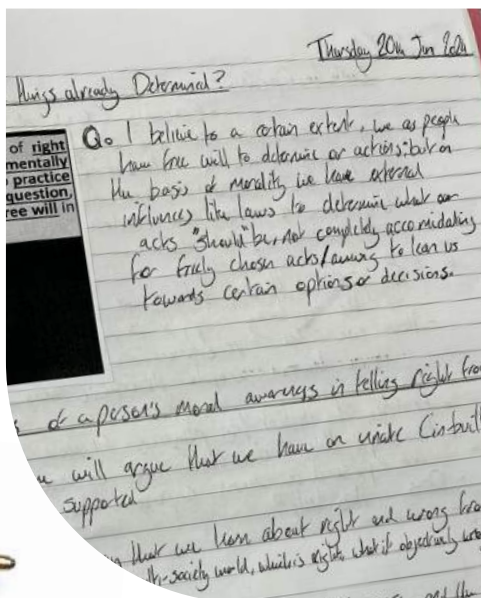


Year 11 & 13 *Exams*

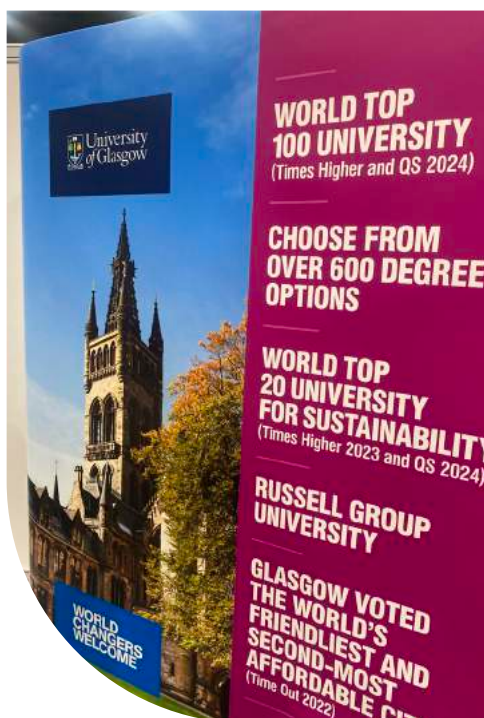
UCAS Discovery Exhibition



Our Year 12 students visited a UCAS event on 14th June. The primary goal was to help them decide on their next steps after St Mary's. These events are designed to provide information, advice, and guidance to support university applications. At the event, universities and colleges from across the country were present to discuss the courses they offer and the benefits of studying with them. It was a fantastic opportunity for the students to ask questions directly and gather information that could help shape their decisions. They were able to explore a wide range of academic and vocational pathways, which really broadened their horizons.

The students had the chance to speak with employers and apprenticeship providers. This was incredibly useful for those considering alternatives to traditional university education. The event showcased a variety of career opportunities, giving students insight into what different industries have to offer and what skills and qualifications they might need. Beyond academic and career guidance, the UCAS event also featured a range of lifestyle promotions. These included travel options, financial planning, and budget management advice, all provided by UCAS Media. This holistic approach ensured that students not only thought about their educational and career paths but also considered how to manage their finances and plan for their futures in a practical sense.

Pupil Inset Day

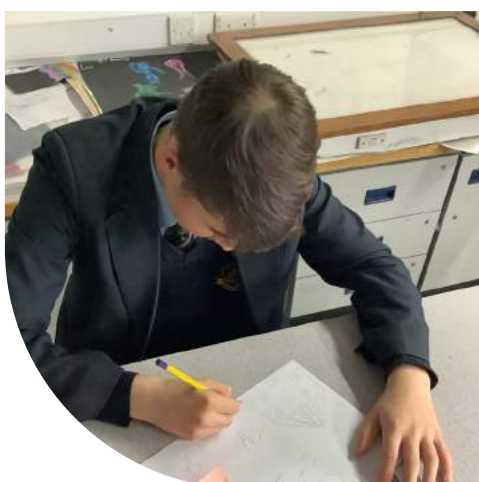
St Mary's Catholic College innovatively turned the tables on pupils in April hosting a unique 'Teacher Training Day' specifically designed for students instead of the usual staff 'Inset' days'. Typically, on such days, students would work from home while staff engage in professional development. However, students were invited to participate in a 'Pupil Inset Day' led by the teaching and support staff, along with various outside speakers and experts.

During this event, students engaged in diverse training sessions on reading strategies, creativity in the classroom, well-being, careers, revision skills, and exploring the school's mission, vision, and values. We also introduced our pupils to the latest research in areas such as extended writing and relational practice. We introduced a pupil playbook which gave the pupils opportunities to apply this knowledge practically, enhancing their understanding and skills.

We were also delighted to welcome "Loud Speaker" whose mission is to instil vital speaking skills, boost confidence, and create an atmosphere filled with energy and fun. The pupils left the workshops feeling more resilient and confident with knowing how they can conquer this world.

The feedback from students was overwhelmingly positive. They appreciated being treated like teachers for the day, gaining insight into the purpose behind their learning. A year 8 student remarked, "It was good to be able to see why we are learning certain things, and now we can help ourselves and other people in the class like the teachers do."

Year 11 and 13 students had a specially tailored day focusing on revision, career planning, sixth



form, and university information, coupled with an essential well-being session. The school also welcomed visitors from Liverpool John Moores University, who spoke to the students, providing valuable insights and guidance.

Overall, the 'Pupil Inset Day' at St Mary's College was a resounding success, offering students a novel and enriching educational experience. Our aim was to provide our pupils with an overview of our key vision and how we can all work together to succeed together and we certainly did that.

Diversity Group

Shaping Futures

Over the past 18 months the St. Mary's Diversity group have been busy. With two trips to London, York and Leeds and the organisation of 'student professional development' workshops for the entire KS3, KS4 and KS5 cohort during the pupil inset day, they have certainly had their hands full!

In London, the group explored the history of the Windrush generation and were able to appreciate the significant contributions made by the Caribbean people post world war. The second visit to London saw the group visit the British Museum before taking their seats at the Garrick theatre to enjoy an emotional rollercoaster of a play about six young black men and their shocking experiences of racism, discrimination and more. When visiting York and Leeds, students were able to explore further education settings in greater detail whilst also meeting black and minority student panels and outreach programmes. These programmes aim to minimise the barriers and shorten the gap for those statistically less likely to attend further education settings.

All visits and trips were fully funded by 'Shaping Futures' which the diversity group bid for. This saw them nominated for an award at the University of Liverpool where they narrowly missed out! The group have worked tirelessly over the past 18 months and have begun to put in place plans for next year. They will look to implement the following:

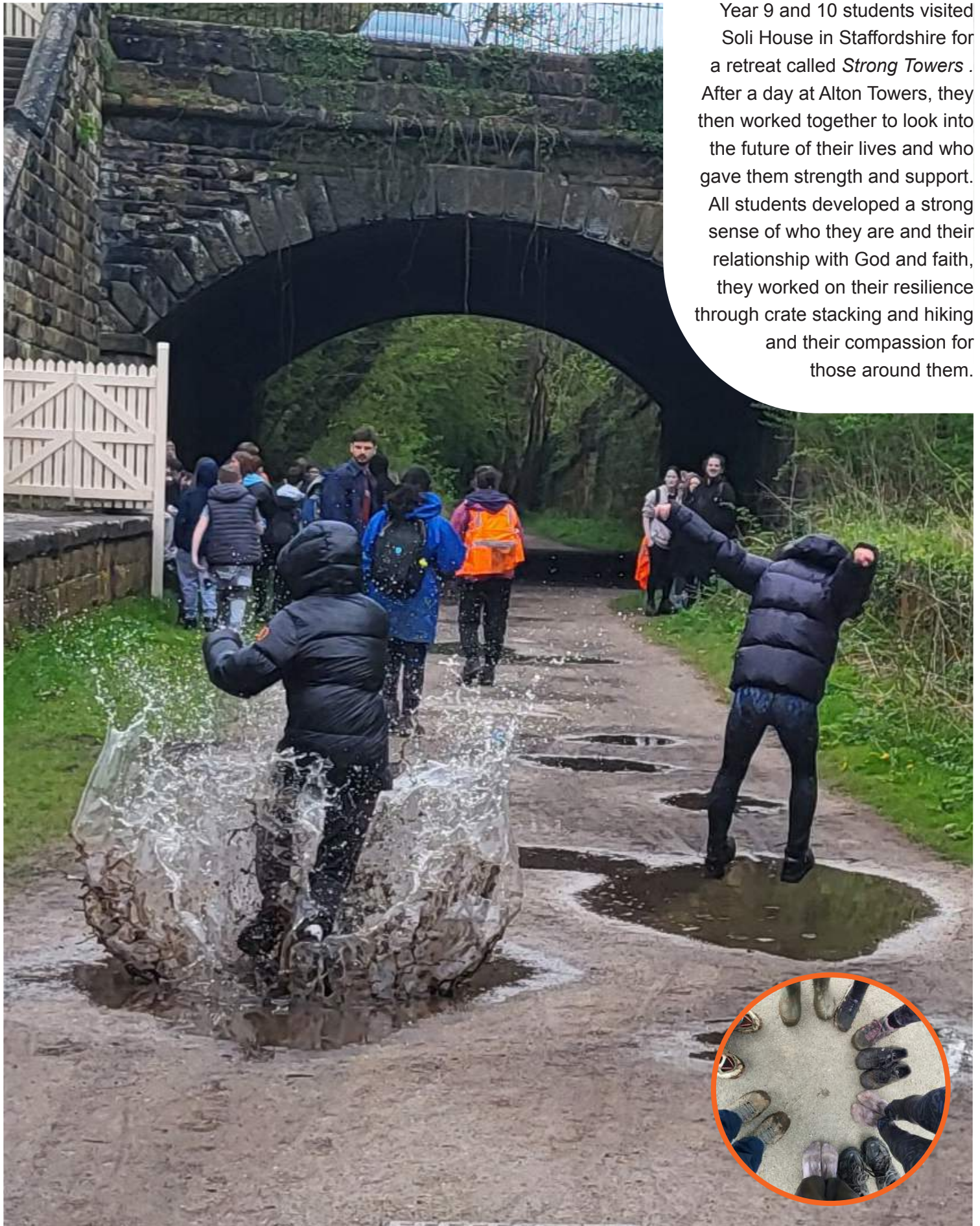

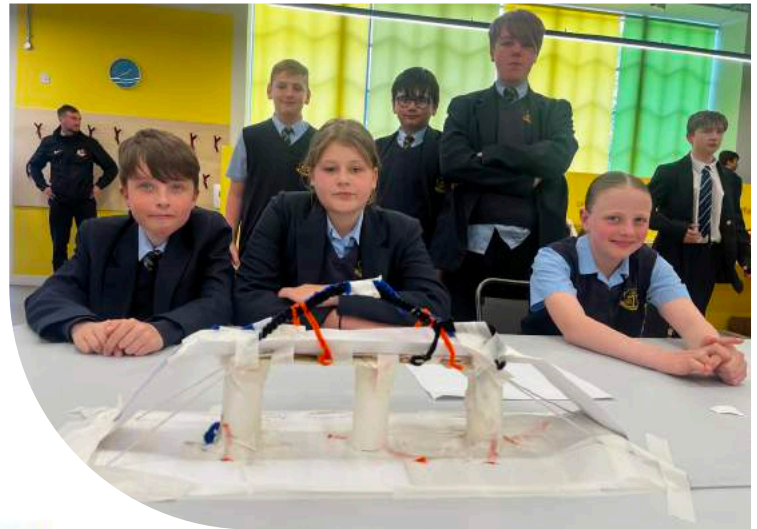
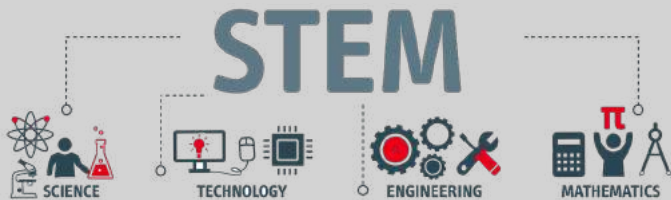

Sixth Form Leavers

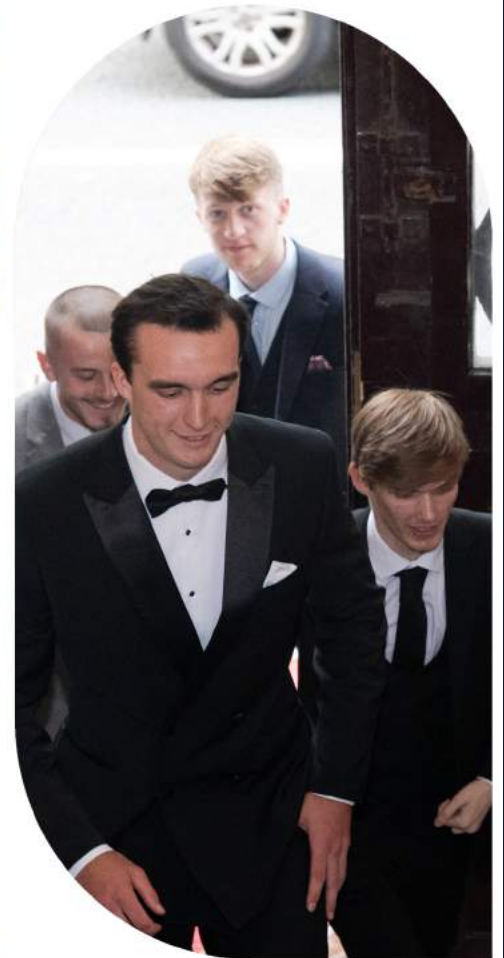
Prom Night

Matthew Harding to represent Team GB

We are thrilled to share the inspiring journey of one of our past students, Matthew, who has achieved remarkable success despite the challenges he has faced. Matthew, who was born with achondroplasia, a form of dwarfism, has defied the odds and is now set to represent Team GB in Powerlifting at the upcoming Paralympic Games in Paris.

From a young age, Matthew showed incredible determination and resilience. "His time at our school was marked by his enthusiasm, positive attitude, and unwavering spirit" said his former Teaching Assistant Mr. Doherty. "These qualities have been instrumental in his journey to becoming an elite athlete. Matthew's story is testament to the power of perseverance and hard work."

Achondroplasia presents unique challenges, but Matthew never let this define him or limit his ambitions. Instead, he embraced his condition and used it as a source of strength. Matthew specialised in swimming for the majority of his sporting career. His rigorous training regime, combined with his mindset, led him to great success in his sport; winning numerous medals at junior and senior levels and breaking two national records, in the 50m and 100m breaststroke.

Matthew's selection to represent Team GB at the Paralympic Games is a fabulous achievement. It is a moment of pride for all of us at St Mary's. His journey serves as an inspiration to current students, showing that with determination,



anything is possible.

As he prepares to compete on the world stage in Paris, we want to extend our congratulations to Matthew.

His journey from our school sports hall to the Paralympic arena is a story of courage, determination, and triumph. We are immensely proud of his accomplishments and are confident that he will represent Team GB with the same spirit and determination that has brought him this far.
